Dr. John Otto has been a veterinarian for over thirty years and a volunteer for the prison program FRIENDS FOR FOLKS for over 24 years. He lives on a hobby farm in Norman, Oklahoma, with his wife, Patti, and he has two sons who help him with rescue pets.



The dogs are from different organizations and are typically victims of abuse or neglect and require substantial patience, care and training in order to become suitable for placement in homes. When training is complete and the animal passes rigorous testing, they are matched with the person most compatible with the dog.

This is just the beginning of what Dr. Otto will tell you about when he comes to talk to us on September 17th. Learn about the trainers of the dogs, helping children of the incarcerated and the books he and his son have written. Marvin???? Who is Marvin???? If you want to know more about Marvin, you will have to come to the meeting.
